

# Social Services Statistics Wales 2014-15 - Summary

Summary document supporting the compendium Social Services Statistics Wales 2014-15, summarising information on personal social services in Wales. The document presents key results for Wales.

## Section 1: Children

This section includes information on looked after children, children in need, children on child protection registers and children in secure units in local authorities in Wales.

Key results for the period 1 April 2014 to 31 March 2015:

- 5,615 children (excluding children looked after in short-term placements) were looked after at 31 March 2015, 128 less than at 31 March 2014.
- There were 19,385 children in need included in the CIN census at 31 March 2015, 95 of who were unborn. Nearly a quarter of children in need were aged under 5 years old, just over a quarter were aged 5-9 years old and nearly a third were aged 10-15 years. The remaining 17 per cent of children in need were aged 16 years or older.
- There were 2,935 children (including unborn children) on child protection registers at 31 March 2015. This is a decrease from 3,135 at 31 March 2014, and represents a rate of 47 children per 10,000 population, based on the 2014 mid year estimate of population aged under 18.

## Section 2: Adults receiving services

This section includes information on social services provided by local authorities in Wales to adults. In this section, the term *older people* refers to all adults aged 65 and over and the term *younger adults* refers to all adults age 18-64, regardless of their client category. It therefore includes clients with physical and sensory disabilities, learning disabilities and those with mental health problems who have also been reported under the relevant client groups in sections 3 to 5.

### Key Results

- Overall, 82 per cent of adults (60,603 adults) were receiving community-based services at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2015. 91 per cent of adults under 65 years old received community-based services compared to 72 per cent for those aged 85 or over. 48 per cent of adults in care homes were aged 85 or over.

## Section 3: Physical and Sensory disability

This section includes information on social services provided by local authorities in Wales to people aged 18 or over with physical or sensory disabilities. The physical and sensory

disabilities registers include people registered under Section 29 of the National Assistance Act 1948, who are normally resident in the local authority area. As registration is voluntary and not all people with disabilities choose to register, the registers are not considered to be a reliable guide to the prevalence of disability.

- At 31 March 2015, there were 15,905 people registered with a visual impairment, of whom 51 per cent were registered as sight impaired and 49 per cent as severely sight impaired.
- There were 13,640 people registered with hearing impairment only, of whom 83 per cent were hard of hearing and 17 per cent were deaf.
- 76,880 people with physical or sensory disabilities reported on local authority registers at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2015, a decrease of 426 people when compared to the previous year.

#### **Section 4: Learning disability**

This section includes information on social services provided by local authorities in Wales to people aged 18 or over with learning disabilities. The register of people with learning disabilities only includes people identified as having a learning disability who are currently known to their local authority for the purposes of planning or providing services.

- At 31 March 2015, there were 15,010 people registered with learning disabilities, compared to 15,297 in the previous year.
- Of these 12,884 were living in community placements and 2,126 were in residential establishments

#### **Section 5: Mental Health**

This section includes information on social services provided by local authorities in Wales to people aged 18 or over with mental health problems.

- 2,498 people with mental health problems were in residential placements in care homes at 31 March 2015.

#### **Section 6: Staffing**

This section includes staff directly employed by local authority social services departments. It does not include staff working for independent sector organisations that are providing services under contracts.

- The total whole-time equivalent (WTE) number of staff directly employed by social services departments at 31 March 2015 was 17,026.
- Of the 21 local authorities who were able to provide data, 71 per cent (12,480) of staff held a required or recommended qualification at 31 March 2015.
- In the 21 local authorities who were able to provide data, 2,903 (14 per cent) of staff were reported as Welsh speakers at 31 March 2015.
