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Questions to the First Minister

Andrew R.T. Davies (South Wales Central): Will the First Minister provide figures for the road mileage undertaken by each member of his cabinet for the year 2007/2008? (WAQ52596)

The First Minister (Rhodri Morgan): Road mileages are not collected separately for each cabinet member. The total mileage undertaken by the Official Car Service for the period is 141,621. This figure includes the mileage undertaken by all cabinet members, Deputy Ministers, the Permanent Secretary and occasional guests of the Welsh Assembly Government.

This however does not include any road mileage accrued on official business using chauffeur companies, taxis or road travel while undertaking official duties outside the UK.

Questions to the Deputy First Minister and Minister for the Economy and Transport

Darren Millar (Clwyd West): Will the Minister state the Welsh Assembly Government's position, including information regarding any discussions with the UK Government, regarding the re-establishment of a direct rail link between Llandudno and Liverpool, and Wrexham and Liverpool, via the improvement of the stretch of railway known as the Halton Curve in Cheshire? (WAQ52599)

The Deputy First Minister and Minister for the Economy and Transport (Ieuan Wyn Jones): I have had no discussions with the UK Government on this subject. The Network Rail draft consultative Wales Route Utilisation Strategy (RUS) identified that through services between Liverpool and Chester/North Wales and Liverpool and Chester/Wrexham could be established if Halton Curve was reinstated and new crossovers were provided. It indicated that more feasibility and appraisal work would be required to progress the scheme.

Further evaluation is being considered through Network Rail's Merseyside RUS.

Mick Bates (Montgomeryshire): What work is currently being undertaken to review WelTAG? (WAQ52601)

The Deputy First Minister: WelTAG is kept under regular review.

Mick Bates (Montgomeryshire): What plans does the Minister have to include an environmental/cost impact assessment within WelTAG? (WAQ52602)

The Deputy First Minister: I intend to keep WeITAG under review to meet all necessary environmental issues.

The environmental impacts currently included in WelTAG are: noise, air quality, greenhouse gas emissions, landscape and townscape, biodiversity, soil, heritage and water environment.

Mick Bates (Montgomeryshire): What monitoring takes place of the free bus travel scheme in Wales? (WAQ52603)

The Deputy First Minister: The Welsh Assembly Government and local authorities monitor the free concessionary bus travel in a range of ways throughout the year. Further scrutiny of local authorities' expenditure is undertaken by external auditors and the Wales Audit Office, as appropriate. Since the scheme was introduced in April 2002, we have commissioned two reviews, carried out by consultants.

Questions to the Minister for Health and Social Services

Andrew R.T. Davies (South Wales Central): Will the Minister make a statement on the full cost of the low secure mental health inpatient service at Whitchurch Hospital, including all apportioned indirect costs and Trust overhead apportionments? (WAQ52597)

The Minister for Health and Social Services (Edwina Hart): The total cost, including all apportioned indirect costs and Trust overhead apportionments, of low secure inpatient forensic psychiatry services provided at Whitchurch Hospital is £2,888,775.

Questions to the Minister for Heritage

Irene James (Islwyn): Will the Minister provide details of Sports Council for Wales capital grants awarded in the Islwyn constituency since April 2003, as well as the names and locations of projects that have received this grant? (WAQ 52466).

The Minister for Heritage (Alun Ffred Jones): Since 2003 the Sports Council for Wales has awarded a range of capital grants totalling nearly £305k to organisations in the Islwyn constituency, mainly for the improvement of facilities and the provision of equipment. A breakdown of these is attached.
